



John Terino is a professor of Comparative Military Strategy and the Chair of the Department of Airpower at the Air Command and Staff College. He joined the faculty in 2008 after more than 22 years as an officer in the Air Force. While on active duty, Dr. Terino served in acquisition, supply, security assistance, and logistics readiness billets. He also earned a PhD in the History and Sociology of Science from the University of Pennsylvania and served tours as a professor at the Air Force

Academy, the Air Command and Staff College, and the School of Advanced Air and Space Studies. At ACSC, he teaches courses on Airpower Theory, Practice, and History; Leadership; Joint Warfighting, and an elective on the Air Force in Fact, Fiction and Film. He is currently working on an edited volume on American popular culture and war and is researching the evolution of precision guided weapons from Vietnam to the present.
